To teach boys and girls ages 11 to 13 how to be more responsible babysitters, St. Luke's Hospital will offer two sessions of its Safe Sitter® class this winter.

Taught by nurses, youth learn safe and nurturing child-care techniques, behavior management skills and appropriate responses to medical emergencies.
