St. Luke's Hospital hosts Wear Red for Women

Cardiologists talk with women about cardiovascular disease Free heart health screenings provided

MAUMEE, Ohio, — Friday, Feb. 5, is National Wear Red Day – a day when Americans nationwide show their support for women's heart disease awareness. St. Luke's Hospital will recognize this special day by hosting its annual National Wear Red Day Community Forum. The free breakfast event will be held on Friday, Feb. 5, from 7 to 8:30 am in the hospital's Auditorium at 5901 Monclova Road in Maumee.

Each year St. Luke's encourages women of the community to wear red and attend this event to learn more about heart health. According to the American Heart Association, heart disease is the No. 1 killer of women. In fact, one in 2.6 women dies from it. But only 20% of women consider heart disease to be their own greatest health risk.

St. Luke's National Wear Red Day Community Forum will feature cardiologists Carolyn Gbur, MD, and Jodi Tinkel, MD. They will share information about women and cardiovascular disease including its risk factors, warning signs, prevention and treatment.

Free heart-healthy screenings will be offered from 6:30 – 7:30 am and 8:30 – 9:30 am. Screenings include carotid; blood pressure; and non-fasting blood sugar and cholesterol. Immediately following the program, a group picture of all attendees dressed in red will be taken. Also a heart healthy breakfast will be provided.
