Bus-eum Traveling Exhibit

Coming May 18 from 1:00-4:00 p.m.

The Evergreen Community Library is thrilled to bring the Bus-eum to our Library. Through this tour, you will see, hear and experience the untold stories of those who were captured as POWs in Nazi Germany. After touring the Bus-eum join us in the Community Room for refreshments.

"Behind Barbed Wire" explores the experiences of Midwest prisoners of war (POWs) in Nazi Germany in WWII, and the human context in which their experiences took place. The St. Paul-based, non-profit educational organization TRACES created this exhibit, which consists of display panels illustrated with photographs, documents, audio and DVD documentaries, artifacts and more. Visitors of the exhibit will gain insights into conditions the POWs experienced; how art, free time, and religion helped POWs survive; assistance that was given by Germans and Austrians; how liberated POWs later came to terms with their experiences.
