ALL-SCHOOL AWARDS ASSEMBLY

The awards program will be held on Friday, May 9 at 8 am in the high school gym. Underclassmen and seniors, including Four County students, will be honored for their academic achievements over the past four years. Seniors are required to wear their cap and gown to the Awards Assembly. The public is welcome to attend.

The Four County Senior Recognition Ceremony will take place Wednesday, May 21 at 9:15 am in the diesel lab at the Four County Career Center. The public is welcome to attend.

OGT UPDATE

Students who took the Ohio Graduation Test in March will receive the results in the same mailing as his/her grade card the week of June 2. Hopefully all students passed all five sections of the test; however, if any of the five sections are failed, retesting in the failed sections(s) is mandatory.

At this time, a summer remediation and testing program is under consideration by EHS. This program would consist of a mandatory 10 hours of instruction by a high school certified teacher, followed by the OGT test. A letter will be mailed home the week of May 12, to the parents of any student who needs to retake any sections of the OGT. This letter will outline the details of the remediation and testing program and ask for parents to let the Evergreen guidance office know if they would like their child to participate. We are tentatively looking at the instruction taking place at the High School June 2 through June 12 and testing taking place on June 16, 17 and 18.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

The Evergreen School District will once again be participating in the "Open Enrollment" program for the 2008-2009 school year. A student from any Ohio school district may apply to attend the Evergreen School District tuition free. Parents/students interested in the Open Enrollment program need to apply in the Superintendent's office.

SENIORS

AP Exams — Students who have registered to take the Advanced Placement exam in calculus or English Literature must pay the \$76 exam fee prior to taking the exam. The AP Calculus exam will take place on Wednesday, May 7 and the English Literature exam will be Thursday May 8. Both exams start promptly at 8 am at Evergreen High School. No make-up testing is allowed.

Selective Service Registration — Young men who are about to turn 18 years or are already 18, need to register with the Selective Service. It is a federal law to register within 30 days of your 18th birthday. You also need to register to be eligible for certain benefits such as federal student aid, job training, and most federal employment. Registration may now be completed on the Internet. You need to have your social security number and then log on to the selective service web site at: <http://www.sss.gov>.

Correspondence Course work — All transcripts for correspondence work, completed for high school credit, are due to the guidance office by Friday, May 9. Students planning to graduate MUST meet the May 9 deadline — no exceptions! This means that all tests and final exams must be taken well in advance of this due date in order for assignments to be corrected and a transcript sent to Evergreen from the American School of Correspondence. The American School does not send or receive assignments, tests, or transcripts via Fax.

Final Transcripts — Final senior transcripts and grade cards will be mailed to seniors and colleges the week of June 9.

High School Commencement — Graduation practice will be Friday, May 23 at 1:00 pm in the high school gym. Seniors must attend this practice in order to participate in the graduation ceremony! The Commencement Ceremony will be Sunday, May 25 at 2 pm, seniors need to report to the high school by 1pm.

CONGRATULATIONS

Luke Horn has been accepted to the University of Toledo where he is the recipient of the Tower Blue Scholarship and the First Generation Award totaling \$16,000.

Mary Kolasinski has been accepted to Northwest State Community College, De-

fiance College, Bowling Green State University and Ohio University.
