The Vikings started the double elimination tournament by defeating Pettisville 44-39 and defeating Delta 37-23.

In the winner's bracket final the Vikings lost to Defiance 33-50 and were sent to the consolation bracket. There the Vikings convincingly defeated Pettisville again 52-28 to get the chance to play Defiance in the championship. The Vikings fell short 66-31; however, were proud to receive the second place trophy which can be seen in the upstairs display case at the high school.
