**ARCHBOLD, OH** – Four major marketing projects produced by Northwest State Community College were awarded top honors during the 2007 National Council for Marketing & Public Relations regional convention in Cincinnati.

Northwest State won the Gold Paragon for the Best College Promotional Video for the unique new College on the Move television infomercial project. A second Gold Paragon was awarded to Northwest State for the new Career Express course listing magazine. Bronze Medallion Awards were given to Northwest State for the 2007 President's Report publication as well as for the Overall Marketing Campaign including radio, TV, publications and billboards that was themed "It Makes You Think."

The awards were part of a record-number of entries from two-year colleges from seven Midwest states and Ontario. They were judged by independent sources from the corporate and private marketing sector.
