Registration Underway for Northwest State Community College Summer and Fall Semesters

Archbald, Ohio – Registration is currently underway for summer and fall semesters at Northwest State Community College, and College officials are encouraging students to register early.

"We have seen a tremendous influx of students over the past several semesters," said Cindy Krueger, vice president for academics at NSCC. "This means that classes are filling up quickly. The earlier students can register, the better chance they have of getting into the classes they need at a time that best fits their schedule."

In an effort to simplify the registration process, One-Stop Registration Days will be held on April 8 from 2:00-4:30 p.m. and April 9 from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. Individuals who have been accepted into the College can make an appointment on either of these days and take the COMPASS assessment, meet with an advisor, register for classes, and get their financial aid in order. If you are unable to attend a One-Stop Registration Day, you can make an individual appointment with an Admissions representative by calling 419.267.1320. Current students can register 24 hours a day by logging in to their myNSCC account at www.northweststate.edu.

Individuals who have not yet been accepted to NSCC can find the application online at www.northweststate.edu or in the Admissions Office in C106 on the main campus. Northwest State Community College offers a wide range of certificate and degree programs in the areas of Allied Health & Public Services, Arts & Sciences, Business Technologies, Engineering Technologies and Nursing. Along with the main campus in Archbald, NSCC also offers classes at satellite locations in Bryan, Defiance, Metamora, Paulding and Van Wert. A variety of online classes are also available to students.

**Are you 60 years of age or older?
Is your total monthly income
\$1178.00 or less per month?**

If you meet both of these requirements then you are eligible for a New Fulton County CSFP monthly food program.

The Commodity Supplemental food Program (CSFP) of the US department of Agriculture (USDA) provides eligible persons a monthly package of food. Recipients receive a six-month refillable prescription for food.

The CSFP 40-50 pound food package contains a combination of the following foods: fruit juices, canned fruit, canned vegetables, unsweetened cereal, pastas, evaporated milk, dry milk, cheese, canned meat, dry beans and peanut butter.

Invasive Species Workshop April 16th in Toledo

Some of our most destructive and competitive species are invasive plants and insects. These non-native species have an advantage since they find growth conditions that allow them to thrive in the absence of natural enemies. Invasive species come in all shapes and sizes and include insects, woodland plants and aquatic plants. In recent years, species like Emerald Ash Borer and Purple Loose Strife have become very destructive in our ash woodland and wetland areas respectively.

Woodland owners and land managers are faced with a daunting task when it comes to invasive species and the land they manage. To help landowners better prepare to manage invasive species, a workshop will be held in NW Ohio on April 16. This workshop will cover the identification of some of the most troublesome species that local landowners face. A variety of control options, from mechanical removal to the more complex chemical options will be discussed to maximize the effectiveness of control efforts.

The indoor portion of the program will be held at the Toledo Botanical Garden on Elmer Drive, between Holland-Sylvania and Reynolds Road, and will begin at 8:30 am. In the afternoon, there will be some demonstrations outside so participants are asked to dress appropriately. Registration closes on April 9th and there is a \$35 registration fee to cover materials.
