Outlook and Policy
Program**

DEFIANCE, Ohio – Farmers, agribusinesses and others in the industry located in northwest Ohio have the opportunity to learn more about ag policy and economics at an Ohio State University Agricultural Outlook and Policy Program meeting.

The program hosted by Ohio State University Extension with presentations from Ohio State's Department of Agricultural, Environmental, and Development Economics. Topics covered will include grain markets, farm inputs, land values, and an economic outlook of the industry. The program will be held on December 7 from 4:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. at Zion's Lutheran Church, 1801 East Second St. Defiance. Registration is \$20 per person.

The program covers Ohio State University Extension's Maumee Valley Extension Education Research Area (Williams, Fulton, Lucas, Defiance, Henry, Paulding, Putnam, Hancock, Van Wert, and Allen counties).

The program will feature the following speakers: Matt Roberts, OSU Extension agricultural economist, who will discuss grain market outlook; Barry Ward, OSU Extension agricultural economist, who will discuss farm inputs and land values; Ian Sheldon, OSU Extension agricultural economist, who will discuss world economic outlook.

The Agricultural Outlook and Policy Program meeting in Defiance is one of eight meetings being held throughout the state in November and December.

On November 7, 2009 from 10:30 to 1:30, the Evergreen Community Library in conjunction with the Metamora Historical Society and the Evergreen Community Learning Center (from the Evergreen Elementary School), presented the program, "Walking Through History". This program was presented in fulfillment of

a grant we received from "We the People Bookshelf" and "Picturing America".

This was a very successful program with an estimated attendance of over 125 people. The Metamora Historical Society, The Lyons Historical Society and The Fulton County Chapter of the Ohio Genealogy Society, all contributed items for the program.

Along with the different society collections, we had colonial reenactors, featuring John and Barb Galbraith and their family, colonial games for children, hands-on activities, different samplings of jellies and pumpkin-apple butter and a multitude of historical documents and artifacts. We also had a child-friendly display featuring different Native American arts and crafts supplied by Mike and Janet Delauter.

The open house relaxed environment was very conducive to public interest and walk-throughs. This was a great inter-generational program in which families could walk through time and share their family's history and memories.
