Enrollment Numbers Continue To Increase at Northwest State

ARCHBOLD, OHIO - Community college enrollment continues to increase across Ohio, and Northwest State Community College is no exception. Richfield Township

There was further discussion on the county charging for dispatch fees if the Township contracts with the Village.

Trustee Nevers contacted Sylvania Township Trustees for information on contracting with Sylvania Township for police protection. The Township requested a letter of intent.

Trustee Nevers contacted Brian Miller (Lucas County Engineer) regarding cleaning out the ten mile creek from the Sylvania line to Fulton Lucas Rd. There was discussion on the liability of residents cutting the logs; Mr. Nevers spoke with Hylant Insurance Company and was advised only township employees are covered, all other individuals must provide proof of insurance.

The speed limit on Sylvania Avenue has changed to 45 mph in front of the Day Care Center.

The fiscal officer contacted Lucas County Prosecutors office regarding the hiring of employee relatives for work within the township; Mr. Borrell advised it is legal assuming the employee is not benefiting financially from the project. Further stating the Trustee involved should not participate in any discussion and not vote.

OLD BUSINESS:

Trustee Nevers spoke with the Lucas County Health Department regarding the property located at 3304 Washburn Rd. The Health Department was not notified of the last court hearing and will be

in court on August 20th, 2009 to address the property issues.

Trustee Winn reported the Personnel Manual is complete. A policy for flowers and gifts with a maximum of \$100.00 will be added to the policy.

Trustee Nevers received quotes for the maintenance building door as follows:

1. Lowe's \$325.00 glass door \$250.00 solid door
2. Carter's \$192.00 glass door \$150.00 solid door.

There was discussion on the window quotes for the maintenance building. H&S Construction was the lowest quote at \$1800.00 for 7 double hung replacement windows with installation and labor. Information will be provided to Mr. Ronau to obtain the windows.

The salt shed repairs will be addressed in the summer of 2010.

There being no further business Arthur Nevers made a motion to adjourn at 8:40 p.m., which was seconded by Karen Winn. Roll call: Winn-yes, Eisel - yes, Nevers - yes. Motion approved.
