"First Day Back to School Report"

On Monday, August 17, Evergreen Local Schools opened its doors to students in grades one through twelve. We had a great first day, although it was extremely busy! Our Preschool and Kindergarten students will officially start school on Tuesday and Thursday, respectively. Their first few days of school are used for orientation and assessment activities that help them make a successful transition into school life. At the time this article went to press, we did not have enough information to accurately predict our district's enrollment for this school year. We remain hopeful that our overall attendance will be up slightly from last year's enrollment of 1284.

If you are new to Evergreen Schools, have another child entering for the first time, or have changed any personal contact data over the summer months, please see that your child's school office has this important information. Also, please log onto our school's website (<http://www.evergreen.k12.oh.us>) in order to register or update your Honeywell Instant Alert profile. Instant Alert allows us to communicate with you almost instantaneously whenever we have pertinent information to share, such as school delays, closures, athletic cancellations, etc. It is up to you to make sure your contact information is up-to-date. If you need any assistance, please call your child's school office. School delay and closure information will also be announced over Archbold's WMTR Radio Station (96.1 FM), and three Toledo TV Channels (Channels 11, 13, & 24).

The H1N1 (Swine Flu) virus has been in the news lately, since there is the possibility the second wave of this virus could impact more people. We plan to send a letter and pamphlet home soon so you have the latest recommendations on how to stay protected from this virus. Information concerning this potential pandemic is changing rapidly, almost on a daily basis. School-wide Lottery Fundraiser

Evergreen High School has just kicked off its school-wide lottery fundraiser. Every class is selling the tickets. Here's how it works:

You may purchase a raffle ticket for \$10 each. You will receive an envelope with a single lottery raffle ticket with a three-digit number. Fill in your name, address, and phone number on the ticket. Give the stub, along with \$10 to the seller. The other part of the ticket is yours to keep for your records. If your three-digit raffle number matches IN ORDER, the number of the EVENING Ohio Lottery Pick Three drawing on any day (Monday through Sunday) in October 2008, you are a winner. Since this three-digit number is yours for the entire month, there is a chance you could win more than once. If your number is drawn Monday thru Friday or Sunday, you will receive a \$100 prize. On Saturdays, the winning number receives a \$500 prize. All the winners will be notified by mail as well as posted in the high school office. (All profits are split between the classes.)
